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How can I use these amazing stories with my students?

RA's audio is challenging for our students, and we must carefully scaffold our listening activities in order that they may gain the most benefit from the experience. What follows are general guidelines, suggestions. Have other suggestions? Let me know!

Pre listening Activities

Find images, songs and/or short readings to frame the context of the story. Share new vocabulary and encourage brainstorming about story content. Introduce narrator(s) and general arc of the story.

During Listening

Don't be afraid to assign small chunks of audio vs entire recording. Encourage students to keep listening journals as a way to chronicle what strategies worked, didn't work, questions, etc to bring to class and discuss. Experiment with the use of the transcript in class as a way to build students' confidence in their abilities. Sometimes drawing or mapping a story promotes new ways of listening.

Post Listening

Encourage your students to choose segments or characters that intrigued them and explain why. Think about parallels to other countries, histories and people. Think about the parallels between these stories and our own lives.
